



A Report on Chief Minister Institutional Plantation Programme

A unique plantation programme was launched in our institution on 18th July, 2022. It is carried out for implementation the Chief Minister Institutional Plantation Programme (CMIPP). The main purpose of this programme is the conservation of important native plant spices and the beautification of institutional premises with ample greenery.

We, the office employees selected the samplings of Guava, Mango, Night Jasmine, Deodar and Indian Gooseberry for this special plantation programme.

Smti. Devajyoti Gogoi, Principal planted the sapling of Guava, the scientific name of which is **psidium guajava**. The guava tree gives us fruits that makes us healthy. It is also beneficial for medicinal purpose.


Runjun Handique, Graduate Instructor (Arts) of this institution planted the sapling of Night Jasmine, the scientific name of which is **Nyctanthes arbor-tristis**. This plant is useful for its roots, flower and seeds. It is also used for medicinal purposes.

Jharna Sonowal, Carft Instructor of this institution planted the sapling of Indian Gooseberry, the scientific name of which is **phyllanthus emblica**. Indian Gooseberry has multiple uses such as fruit, Amla-Murabba, pickle, boiled amla as a regular diet, amla oil and medicinal purpose.

Sri Brojen Handique, the Grade-IV employee of this institution selected the Deodar sapling. The scientific name of Deodar is **Cedreus Deodar**. It is also known as the "Tree of Gods". It is ornamental and suitable for birds' shelter.

Sri Bhupen Dutta, the Grade-IV employee of this institution planted the Mango sapling, the scientific name of which is **Mangifera Indica**.

This programme of plantation was carried out as a part of nationwide campaign "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav".
